

Political framework

Thematic research is politically determined

- An annual agreement on the distribution of the research reserve (the Danish government and political parties)
- Thematic research funds are allocated to DFF
- A principle of keeping at arm's length
 - Themes are formulated by politicians with certain intensions
 - Grants are awarded by the committee using the politically determined theme description as guidance (criteria)

DFF has funded thematic research since 2018

Themes may

– and do – vary

from year to year

Great political attention towards DFF's handling of thematic funds

Defined themes?

There are no (exact) definition of the relevant theme

- DFF encourages politicians to ensure broad themes with emphasis on and room for applicants' own ideas
- DFF's calls for proposals use the texts as formulated in the political agreement 1:1 (with few minor additions)
- Some themes have short descriptions of the theme

What should you do as an applicant?

 Explain clearly how your project addresses/relates to the given theme and how you define/understand it

What will the thematic committee do?

Assess each application in relation to theme and criteria

In other words: Make sure to address the following criterion:

Does the application sufficiently account for how the project addresses the theme applied for as described in the call for proposals, including the theme-specific requirements that apply to your application?



DFF-Thematic (new instrument)

DFF introduces the funding instrument "DFF-Thematic"

The purpose of the new funding instrument is twofold:

- 1. Addressing and acknowledging the transformation of the politically determined themes, which to a greater extent than before concerns for, e.g., practice-oriented research, or interdisciplinary research, which requires a new instrument
- 2. Simultaneously, aiming at better targeting the fund's instruments across both independent and thematic research

DFF has introduced a new funding instrument called DFF-Thematic

The new funding instrument is available only for thematic calls

DFF-Thematic consists of a number of basic building blocks (apply to all themes) and relevant, additional building blocks relating to each specific theme

DFF-Thematic (new instrument)

Four <u>basic</u> building blocks

Co-PI required

Projects must have an applicant and a Co-PI. Both must have a PhD degree or similar qualifications (some themes have further requirements)



Application containing a project description and an appendix that describe the research project altogether, incl. relevance for theme, societal impact, (if relevant) collaboration with practice area, other theme-specific requirements.



Projects can have a duration of up to 5 years



Depends on the applied for theme, but typically up to DKK 5 million excluding overhead

DFF-Thematic (new instrument)

Additional, theme-specific building blocks

Involvement

Some themes require applications to be practiceoriented and involve a relevant practice area; other themes require involvement of local communities



Some themes require collaboration by having the applicant and the Co-PI come from different research environments and/or research institutions



Some themes require that applications are multidisciplinary, and that the applicant and Co-PI therefore must be from different research disciplines



Some themes require that applications include at least one PhD student or postdoctoral candidate in order for support research capacity building or similar DFF has introduced a new funding instrument called DFF-Thematic

DFF-Thematic consists of a number of basic building blocks (apply to all themes) and relevant, additional building blocks relating to each specific theme

Postdoctoral exchange programme in quantum research

Funding instrument: DFF-International Postdoctoral Grant (thematic)

- Purpose of strengthening the international mobility of younger talented researchers within the field of quantum research
- Budget: Up to DKK 1,500,000 excl. overhead
 - Possible to apply for an increase of DKK 55,000 for each accompanying family member (partners and minor children)
- Applicant must have PhD age (or similar qualifications) of max. 5 years or, if currently a PhD student, submit PhD thesis for defence within 12 months after the application deadline
- Spend 12 consecutive months at a research institution abroad
- Spend 12 months at the administrating institution (Danish, Faroese or Greenlandic research institution)
 - You may spend up to 6 months at the beginning and / or up to 12 months at the end of the project period at the administrating institution

DFF's new funding instrument "DFFThematic" does not apply for "Postdoctoral exchange programme in quantum research"

Instead, DFF-International Postdoctoral Grant must be applied for

DFF expects to grant approx. 8 applications for the theme "Postdoctoral exchange programme in quantum research"

About the application

General requirements, budget etc.



Preparation before applying

Start well in advance!

- Read the Call for Proposals thoroughly there is a great chance of finding the answers you might be looking for
- Find the right application form in e-grant and open it early on
 - It is possible to re-open and re-submit your application up until the deadline
- Find the necessary DFF templates
 - Templates for project description, appendix, budget (in e-grant)
 and budget confirmation

General requirements

- Applications must be written in English
- Applicants (and Co-PIs for DFF-Thematic) must have obtained a PhD degree or equivalent qualifications
- Applications must be initiated and submitted in e-grant by the researcher responsible (applicant) for the project and responsible to the fund in relation to the submitted project

No requirements

- Citizenship
- Location of research institutions,
 e.g. administrating institution
- Geographic location of research activities
- Employment prior to applying or obtaining a DFF grant



Please note that you must use the DFF budget template!

- Your budget must account for the entire project period and describe the activities to be funded
- You can apply for funding to cover all expenses that are directly attributable to the project, and which are relevant and necessary for the completion of the project, including:
 - Scientific/academic salaries (VIP)
 - Technical/administrative salaries (TAP)
 - Equipment expenses (exceeding DKK 500,000 excluding overhead/administration expenses)
 - Operating expenses (including equipment expenses up to DKK 500,000 excluding overhead/ administration expenses)
 - Overhead/administration expenses (calculation based on the overhead percentage)

Please confer the budget section in the call (5.3.7)

You find the budget template directly in e-grant in your application form ("Upload budget" step)

Make sure to comply with the budget amount limits for the respective funding instruments

Specific exceptions

- DFF does not fund expenses towards Open Access
- Items covered by institutions' overhead: normal work PC's, general software, and other general work tools etc.

Make sure

- That you argue for all expenses; DFF can cut all unspecified expenses
- To have proportionality between the project's costs and the expected scientific output
- To account for all funding from other sources and co-financing (both active and non-active participants)
- To start early!

Make sure to comply with the budget amount limits for the respective funding instruments

Typical question regarding practice-oriented projects:

- Can I apply for funding for buy-out of project participants, which are not categorised as VIP or TAP, e.g. professionals such as nurses, pedagogues, teachers, etc.?
- Yes. You can apply for funding for compensation of the working hours during which they contribute to the project, so that they can be relieved from their regular work tasks and participate in the project
- The funds must be stated as operating expenses, e.g. as remuneration
- Expenses must be described in the budget, including the number of working hours for which compensation is sought as well as the relevance of these expenses to the project

Typical question regarding clinical projects:

- Can I apply for funding for fees related to the research ethical assessment of my application, which may be required before the start of the project (if funded)?
- Yes. You can apply for all expenses that are directly attributable to the project, and which are relevant and necessary for the completion of the project
- DFF considers such fees to be directly attributable to the project
- The national rules concerning such fees for non-commercial projects has changed in January 2024 – and non-commercial projects are no longer exempted from these fees

Typical question regarding Arctic projects:

- Can I apply for funding for interpreting assistance or special rights holders and stakeholders in Arctic projects?
- Yes. You can apply for funding for compensation of the working hours during which they contribute to the project, so that they can be relieved from their regular work tasks and participate in the project
- It is possible to apply for necessary additional expenditures for travel and stay, e.g. in relation to the participation of persons from the local population and/or Indigenous Peoples
- Funds to cover interpreting assistance can also be applied for
- The funds must be stated as operating expenses, e.g. as remuneration

Formal requirements

Your application must comply with a number of general requirements before given active consideration.

Typical mistakes:

- Submitting too late
- Submitting applications with a project description or an appendix that is too long or even missing
- Applications with missing or too long CVs
- Applications with missing list of publications

of requirements

DFF will not obtain further information or supplementary application materials after the application deadline

Your application will be rejected administratively, if it doesn't comply with the requirements

Application and assessment

All applications will be assessed according to the criteria listed in the call for proposals:


- Fulfillment of theme's objectives and requirements for instrument
- Scientific quality of the project
- Scientific qualifications of the applicant, Co-PI and participant(s)
- Feasibility
- Publication and dissemination of results
- Other assessment criteria

A broad range of assessment criteria

Each application is assessed individually and given a concrete and overall evaluation, where the various criteria can be met to a greater or lesser extent

Please note that the competition is fierce

Application form in e-grant

Once again: Start well in advance!

- Many different fields must be filled in with different information
- Your application <u>does not</u> just consist of a project description and your CV – a number of other appendices are relevant
- Make sure to submit your application in good time before the application deadline

Periods of leave

- When calculating your PhD age, certain types of documentable leave must be deducted
- Periods of leave that must be deducted include:
 - Pregnancy, maternity, paternity, parental, adoption leave
 - Bereavement leave
 - Formal leave to care for a close relative who is seriously ill or dying (care's leave)
 - Long-term sick leave of a minimum of 21 consecutive days
 - Military service
 - Clinical employment, which have constituted a necessary part of the course of an education during which the time for research has been very limited
 - Full-time humanitarian aid work in a foreign country

See section 5.3.5 regarding calculation of PhD age and periods of leave

Please only state periods of leave which has been held after your PhD

Pregnancy, maternity, paternity or parental and adoption leave will be deducted from your PhD age by a factor 2 instead of 1

Counting tool

Counting the number of characters

The appendices "Project description", "Appendix" and "Applicant's CV" must adhere to the requirements regarding maximum permitted number of pages and characters. As various text-editor programs use different methods for counting the number of characters, DFF recommends using the e-grant system to verify that the number of characters in your application is within the permitted number. DFF will always use e-grant's character count as a basis for the decision of whether a document fulfils the requirements or not. In this regard, DFF recommends that you, as the applicant, continuously generate a PDF-file of your CV, project description and appendix and upload these documents to the application. If the document exceeds the permitted length, or if the document's number of characters cannot be counted by the system, you will receive a warning that the document does not meet the requirements and have the opportunity to upload a new document. Alternatively, you can make use of e-grant's **counting tool** without needing to create and navigate through an application. The counting tool will inform you how many characters e-grant has detected in the uploaded PDF file. Please note that this component only functions as a PDF counting tool and that you will not be notified if you exceed the set requirements.

DFF will reject applications that exceed the permitted number of pages or characters in the project description, the appendix and the applicant's CV in accordance with **section 6.1**. Hence, you will not be able to upload a revised document to DFF if the document exceeds the permitted requirements when the deadline expires.

Use counting tool to check these appendices:

- Project description
- Appendix (new)
- Applicant's CV

Make sure to read this box in section 5.3 of the call for proposals!


Make sure that your project description, appendix and your CV as an applicant complies with the maximum number of pages and characters

■ Political set for themes


